AUSTIN, TX— Americans for the Arts today presented the 2005 Public Art Network (PAN) Award to Public Art Fund at its annual convention in Austin, TX. The Public Art Network Award was created to recognize and honor innovative and creative contributions and commitment in the field of public art.
